



Deadline to Pay Taxes Extended for Michigan Residents

Following Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin's announcements extending the deadlines for filing and paying federal taxes, Governor Gretchen Whitmer signed Executive Order 2020-26 on Friday, March 27, 2020. Order 2020-26 gives Michigan residents an additional 3 months to file their state and city income taxes.

This order is effective immediately and extends deadlines as follows:

- Annual state and city income tax returns or payments, and payment of estimated state or city income taxes, otherwise due on April 15, 2020, will now be due on July 15, 2020.
- Annual state and city income tax returns or payments, and payment of estimated state or city income taxes, otherwise due on April 30, 2020, will now be due on July 31, 2020.
- Penalties and interest for failure to file will not begin to accrue until July 16, 2020 for any remaining unpaid balances due on July 15, 2020.
- Penalties and interest for failure to file will not begin to accrue until August 1, 2020 for any remaining unpaid balances due on July 31, 2020.

These extensions are automatic. Michigan residents do not need to take any additional steps to qualify.
